

GRADUATE STUDENT PAPER PRESENTATION COMPETITION AWARDS

Awards in recognition of the top paper presentations during the Annual Meeting of the CSAS were first presented in 1978. Each award is a cheque for \$250, \$150 and \$100 for first, second and third place, respectively. The award is eligible to a member of CSAS, enrolled in a M.Sc. or Ph.D. program, registered for the Annual Meeting, and is the senior author and presenter of their research. Paper presentations must be made during the technical sessions for the Graduate Student Paper Presentation Competition. Winners are selected by a panel of three judges and awards announced at the annual CSAS banquet.

GRADUATE STUDENT POSTER PRESENTATION COMPETITION AWARD

Awards in recognition of the top graduate student poster presentations during the the Annual Meeting of the CSAS were first presented in 1997. Each award is a cheque for \$250, \$150 and \$100 for first, second and third place, respectively. An award is eligible to a member of CSAS, enrolled in a M.Sc. or Ph.D. program, registered for the Annual Meeting, and is the senior author and presenter of their research. Posters must be presented during the technical sessions for the Graduate Student Poster Presentation Competition. Winners are selected by a panel of three judges and awards announced at the annual CSAS banquet.

UNDERGRADUATE AWARDS OF EXCELLENCE

Awards in recognition of superior academic achievement in Animal/Poultry Science during the first three years of study within each of the Faculties of Agriculture at each Canadian university were first presented in 1971. Awards are eligible to an undergraduate student who has demonstrated superior academic performance during the first three years of related studies and who has enrolled in the fourth year in animal/poultry science. Each award includes a cheque for \$100, and a one year membership in CSAS (not including CJAS). The awards are given annually, one for each of the following: University of British Columbia, University of Alberta, University of Saskatchewan, University of Manitoba, University of Guelph, Macdonald College, University of Laval and Nova Scotia Agricultural College. Requests for nominees will be sent in the spring by the CSAS Awards Committee Chair to encourage university department representatives to nominate their winner in the summer. Each College/University should nominate a winner and an alternate to be awarded if the winner fails to register for the fourth year in animal/poultry science.
